The meeting was called to order by Vicki Vaughn at 10:00 a.m.

Additions/deletions to Agenda: None

Jennifer Rentfrow made the motion that the agenda be accepted with the addition of billing questions. Vicki Vaughn supported the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Jennifer Rentfrow made the motion to approve the minutes as presented. Vicki Vaughn supported the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

The check register was reviewed. Jennifer Rentfrow made the motion to approve the checks in the amount of \$721,907.68 and the direct payments of \$91,692.78. Vicki Vaughn supported the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Phil Alt reported that there was an increase in census compared to the previous year.

Phil Alt presented the quarterly financial report. There has been a slight decrease in cash since December, but it was reported that the reserves were not utilized during this period. Jennifer Rentfrow made the motion to accept the quarterly financial report as presented. Vicki Vaughn supported the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Rayann Franco provided a report for Corporate Compliance. There was one Corporate Compliance investigation. The report was reviewed and approved by the consultant.

Linda Duchon reported that there were currently no staff or residents with COVID or influenza.

Linda Duchon reported that the IT department will be attending a demonstration with her for software for work orders. This will not only track work orders but will also track drills and inspections.

Linda Duchon reported that she met with the IT department. There will be a new process for adding and deleting employees regarding access. Digital faxing will be implemented soon. Sharepoint is live and policies are being added.

Linda Duchon reported that there was a cyber security event with Ascension which we use for lab work. Ascension was only able to process stat labs. A new contract was signed with another company so that routine labs can be done.

Linda Duchon stated that the plan of correction has been submitted. There were two life safety code K-tags that we received tags on last year. There were six F-tags.

Linda Duchon reported that nursing home week was a success. Meals and activities correlated with them for that day.

Linda Duchon stated that she has signed a contract with a new agency to get more nurses. She explained that the new staffing requirements will be a challenge for smaller nursing facilities.

Linda Duchon presented the new attendance policy. Jennifer Rentfrow made the motion to approve the policy. Vicki Vaughn supported the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion regarding the search for a new administrator. Copies of the job description and last job posting has been forwarded to the board.

Linda Duchon explained that protocol for the recent tornado warning. All residents that triggered for tornados in their trauma informed care assessment had employees visiting with them during the time of the warning.

Linda Duchon will investigate a resident and a family having private cook outs on the facility grounds.

The regulations state that residents must have access to a resident refrigerator that is located in a public area. One has been placed in the resident ty room.

A former resident's family member approached a board member regarding their bill. It was explained that there was a credit because the family had made a large payment. That payment was reported as non-sufficient funds by the bank after several attempts so the credit was reversed. The family was provided with a final bill.

SURVEY RESULTS

On March 20, 2024, a Complaint Survey was completed at Cass County Medical Care Facility, by the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (MDLARA) to determine if your facility was in compliance with the Federal requirements for nursing homes participating in the Medicare and Medicaid programs. This survey found that your facility was not in substantial compliance, with the most serious deficiency at scope and severity (S/S) level G, cited as follows:

- F658 -- S/S: G -- 483.21(b)(3)(i) -- Services Provided Meet Professional Standards
- F684 -- S/S: G -- 483.25 -- Quality Of Care

The State agency advised you of the deficiencies that led to this determination and provided you with a copy of the survey report (CMS-2567).

SUMMARY OF ENFORCEMENT REMEDIES

As a result of the survey findings, and as authorized by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), the MDLARA notified you of the imposition of the following remedies, as well as your appeal rights:

Discretionary Denial of Payment for New Admissions effective April 13, 2024

Based on the survey findings, CMS is imposing the following additional remedy:

Federal Civil Money Penalty

The MDLARA conducted a revisit of your facility and found that your facility was in substantial compliance as of April 13, 2024. As a result, the final status of remedies is as follows:

 Discretionary Denial of Payment for New Medicare and Medicaid Admissions did not go into effect.

- Mandatory Termination will not be imposed.
- Federal Civil Money Penalty is being imposed, see below.

The authority for the imposition of remedies is contained in §§ 1819(h) and 1919(h) of the Social Security Act ("Act") and Federal regulations at 42 C.F.R. Part 488, Subpart F, Enforcement of Compliance for Long-Term Care Facilities with Deficiencies.

CIVIL MONEY PENALTY

In determining the amount of the CMP that we are imposing, we have considered your facility's history, including any repeated deficiencies; its financial condition; and the factors specified in the Federal requirement at 42 CFR § 488.404. We are imposing the following CMP:

- Federal Civil Money Penalty of \$11,994.00 per instance for the instance of noncompliance at F658(S/S: G) identified in the CMS-2567 for the survey ending March 20, 2024.
- Federal Civil Money Penalty of \$11,995.00 per instance for the instance of noncompliance at F684(S/S: G) identified in the CMS-2567 for the survey ending March 20, 2024.

The total CMP is \$23,989.00. If you believe that you have documented evidence that should be considered in establishing the amount of the CMP, the following documents should be submitted electronically to Phyllis King at Phyllis.King@cms.hhs.gov within fifteen (15) days from the receipt of this notice:

- Written, dated request specifying the reason(s) financial hardship is alleged
- Brief summary listing the supporting documents being submitted
- Current balance sheet
- Current income statement
- Current cash flow statement
- Most recent, full-year audited financial statements prepared by an independent accounting firm (including footnotes). If audited financial statements are not available, tax returns may be substituted.
- Most recent full-year audited financial statements of the home office and/or related entities (including footnotes). If audited financial statements are not available, tax returns may be substituted.
- Disclosure of expenses and amounts paid/accrued to the home office and/or related entities.
- Schedule showing amounts due to/from related companies, or individuals, included in the balance sheets. The schedule should list the names of related organizations, or persons, and indicate where the amounts appear on the balance sheet (e.g., Accounts Receivable, Notes Receivable, etc.).
- A letter from a financial institution denying the provider's loan request for the amount of the CMP. This does not apply to CMPs to be held in escrow.
- · Copy of tax returns for the preceding two years
- Documentation of any/all financing arrangements including mortgages, long term debt, and lines of credit.
- · Organizational chart with an explanation/description concerning the related entities, and
- Signed attestation statement by the Administrator, CFO, CEO, and Owner.

CMP REDUCTION IF NO APPEAL IS FILED

If CMS does not receive a request for a hearing from a facility, the facility will be deemed to have waived its right to a hearing 60 days from May 21, 2024, CMS will then reduce the CMP by 35%.

CMP PAYMENT

In accordance with 42 C.F.R. §§ 488.331 and 488.431, CMS may collect this imposed CMP and place the monies in an escrow account before a final administrative hearing. The CMP will be collected on the earliest date of the following:

- The date on which an Independent Informal Dispute Resolution ("Independent IDR" or "IIDR") process is completed, if applicable; or
- The date that is 90 calendar days after the date of the notice of imposition of the CMP.

The CMP is due 75 days after the notice of the penalty when CMS has not received a hearing request from the facility or 15 days after the determination of noncompliance is upheld after a final administrative decision.

You can make payments directly from a bank account through the CMP Pay.gov portal: https://www.pay.gov/public/form/start/998675240. We encourage the use of payment through Pay.gov to avoid delay in processing payment. It is an easy and convenient system that is available 7 days a week - 24 hours a day. You will be asked to provide your CCN and the CMP Case Number.

A CMP Case Number will be assigned to your case only when the final CMP is due and payable. At that time, you will receive a notice from this office with the CMP case number and payment instructions. Prior to the assignment of a CMP case number, you must ensure that your facility's name, CCN, and the enforcement cycle start date appear on any correspondence pertaining to this CMP.

- Your CMS Certification Number (CCN) is 235352
- The start date for this cycle is March 20, 2024

If the total amount of the CMP is not received by the due date, interest will be assessed in accordance with the regulations at 42 C.F.R. § 488.442 on the unpaid balance of the penalty beginning on the due date. The unpaid balance of the CMP, and any interest accrued after the due date, will be deducted from sums owing to you without any further notification from this office.

NURSE AIDE TRAINING PROHIBITION

Please note that Federal law, as specified in the Act at § 1819(f)(2)(B) and § 1919(f)(2)(B), prohibits approval of nurse aide training and competency evaluation programs and nurse aide competency evaluation programs offered by, or in, a facility which, within the previous two

years, has operated under a § 1819(b)(4)(C)(ii)(II) or § 1919(b)(4)(C)(ii) waiver (i.e., waiver of full-time registered professional nurse); has been subject to an extended or partial extended survey as a result of a finding of substandard quality of care; has been assessed a total civil money penalty of not less than \$12,924; has been subject to a denial of payment, the appointment of a temporary manager or termination; or, in the case of an emergency, has been closed and/or had its residents transferred to other facilities.

Because a civil money penalty of \$12,924 or more was assessed, this provision is applicable to your facility. Therefore, Cass County Medical Care Facility is prohibited from offering or conducting a Nurse Aide Training and/or Competency Evaluation Program (NATCEP) for two years from May 21, 2024. You will receive further information regarding this from the State agency. This prohibition remains in effect for the specified period even though other actions relating to remedies are being taken, as indicated above. However, under Public Law 105-15, you may contact the State agency and request a waiver of this prohibition if certain criteria are met.

APPEAL RIGHTS

This formal notice imposed the following remedy:

Federal Civil Money Penalty

If you disagree with the finding of noncompliance, which resulted in this imposition, you or your legal representative may request a hearing before an administrative law judge of the Department of Health and Human Services, Departmental Appeals Board (DAB). Procedures governing this process are set out in Federal regulations at 42 CFR § 498.

You are required to file your appeal electronically at the Departmental Appeals Board Electronic Filing System Web site (DAB E-File) at https://dab.efile.hhs.gov/. To file a new appeal using DAB E-File, you first need to register a new account by: (1) clicking Register on the DAB E-File home page; (2) entering the information requested on the "Register New Account" form; and (3) clicking Register Account at the bottom of the form. If you have more than one representative, each representative must register separately to use DAB E-File on your behalf.

The e-mail address and password provided during registration must be entered on the login screen at https://dab.efile.hhs.gov/user_sessions/new to access DAB E-File. A registered user's access to DAB E-File is restricted to the appeals for which he is a party or authorized representative. Once registered, you may file your appeal by:

- Clicking the File New Appeal link on the Manage Existing Appeals screen, then clicking Civil Remedies Division on the File New Appeal screen.
- Entering and uploading the requested information and documents on the "File New Appeal-Civil Remedies Division" form.

At minimum, the Civil Remedies Division (CRD) requires a party to file a signed request for hearing and the underlying notice letter from CMS that sets forth the action taken and the party's appeal rights. A request for a hearing should identify the specific issues and the findings of fact and conclusions of law with which you disagree, including a finding of substandard quality of

care, if applicable.

It should also specify the basis for contending that the findings and conclusions are incorrect. The DAB will set the location for the hearing. Counsel may represent you at a hearing at your own expense.

All documents must be submitted in Portable Document Format ("PDF"). Any document, including a request for hearing, will be deemed to have been filed on a given day, if it is uploaded to DAB E-File on or before 11:59 p.m. ET of that day.

A party that files a request for hearing via DAB E-File will be deemed to have consented to accept electronic service of appeal-related documents that CMS files, or CRD issues on behalf of the Administrative Law Judge, via DAB E-File. Correspondingly, CMS will also be deemed to have consented to electronic service. More detailed instructions for using DAB E-File in cases before the DAB's Civil Remedies Division can be found by clicking the button marked E-Filing Instructions after logging-in to DAB E-File.

Please note that <u>all</u> hearing requests must be filed electronically unless you have no access to the internet or a computer. In those circumstances, you will need to provide an explanation as to why you are unable to file electronically and request a waiver from e-filing with your written request. A request for a hearing must be filed no later than 60 days from the date of receipt of this notice.

INFORMAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION

The State agency offered you an opportunity for informal dispute resolution (IDR) following its survey visit. A request for IDR will not delay the effective date of any enforcement action. However, IDR results will be considered when applicable.

INDEPENDENT INFORMAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION (INDEPENDENT IDR)

In accordance with 42 CFR § 488.431, when a civil money penalty subject to being collected and placed in an escrow account is imposed, you have one opportunity to question cited deficiencies through an Independent IDR process. You may also contest scope and severity assessments for deficiencies which resulted in a finding of SQC or immediate jeopardy.

To be given such an opportunity, you are required to submit your written request, along with the specific deficiencies being disputed, and an explanation of why you are disputing those deficiencies (or why you are disputing the scope and severity assessments of deficiencies which have been found to constitute SQC or immediate jeopardy) via the iMPROve Health www.improve.health/idr.

This request must be submitted within 10 calendar days of receipt of this offer. However, a facility may not use both IDR and independent IDR for the same deficiency citation(s) arising from the same survey unless the IDR process was completed prior to the imposition of the civil money penalty. An incomplete Independent IDR process will not delay the effective date of any enforcement action.

High and Mighty

Tallness takes various forms in our world, from the graceful necks of giraffes to the towering structures of modern cities. Giraffes, the world's tallest land animals, can reach up to 18 feet in height. Their long necks aren't just for show; they help these gentle giants browse leaves high in the trees. Surprisingly, despite their towering stature, giraffes have the same number of neck vertebrae as humans.

On the urban front, structures like the Burj Khalifa in Dubai stand as engineering marvels. Soaring 2,717 feet in the air, it's the tallest building globally, boasting an observation deck that provides panoramic views. Nearly as tall, the Shanghai Tower in China spirals up 2,073 feet, with the twist serving a dual purpose of reducing wind loads and providing a distinctive aesthetic.

Human height, a subject of fascination, varies across the globe. The Netherlands claims the title for the tallest nation, with an average height of around six feet for Dutch men and five feet, six inches for women. In contrast, the shortest height is found in Southeast Asian countries like Indonesia, where five foot, two inches is the national average.

Giraffes may be the tallest animals, but they aren't the only giants found in nature. Coastal redwoods hold the title for the tallest trees. Hyperion, the record-breaking redwood at 380 feet tall, is no longer accessible to the public, to protect it and the forest that surrounds it. These ancient sentinels, standing for thousands of years, have bark that can be up to a foot thick and protects them from wildfires.

Impressive height, whether in living organisms or structures, fascinates us, each exemplifying unique adaptations or human endeavors that push the limits of what seems possible. These tall things remind us of the diversity and achievements that span the natural and human-made worlds.

In the Company of Fairies



In his 1904 play *Peter Pan*, playwright Sir James Matthew Barrie wrote that when the first baby laughed, the laugh broke into a thousand pieces, and each piece became a fairy. Whether you find fairies nothing but foolish folklore or believe that fairies actually flutter

about the woods and glens, International Fairy Day is June 24.

Indeed, many cultures believe that fairies do exist. In January 2014, residents of Iceland protested the building of a new road for fear that it might disturb the fairies and elves living among the rocks. A survey showed that 54 percent of Icelanders believe in fairies. The Icelandic Road Administration is so familiar with protestations regarding construction and fairies that they provide locals with a five-page document detailing precautions they take so as not to disturb these miniature mythical folk.

Perhaps Iceland's only rival in its belief of fairies is Ireland. Most people are familiar with Ireland's leprechauns guarding pots of gold at the end of rainbows, but fairies are just as common. Fairies, say the Irish, are fallen angels who were not as evil as Satan and so were not banished to hell but to Earth. Fairy culture is so pervasive in Ireland that a certain mushroom is called a fairy mushroom, a type of grass is called fairy flax, and the bells of the foxglove plant are called fairy bells. Fairy mounds, called raths, are believed to be magical fairy dwellings. Visitors to Ireland today can even take guided tours of these mysterious places.

Fairies have also become part of legend in Italy, Japan, and America, where children summon the tooth fairy by placing a lost tooth under their pillows. On average, a tooth in America is worth \$5.84, which is actually down from last year's average of \$6.23—still far less than a pot of gold.

What do you think about fairies? Are they just the stuff of legends, or is there something more to the stories than we know?

We double-dog dare you to celebrate Dare Day on June 1. While it would never be advisable to accept a dare to jump off the Brooklyn Bridge, it is always appropriate to dare to be great. President Theodore Roosevelt said, "Far better is it to dare mighty things, to win glorious triumphs, even though checkered by failure... than to rank with those poor spirits who neither enjoy nor suffer much, because they live in the gray twilight that knows not victory nor defeat."

The first step in daring to be great is to have a positive attitude and let go of any fear of failure. It may be true that society largely judges us on our outcomes, whether we succeed or fail at work or at home, when instead we should all be measured by the fortitude of our character. No matter the outcome of taking a risk, a dare, or an endeavor, as long as you stay self-confident and maintain self-love, then great things are possible.

Oil wrestling is the national sport of Turkey. The rules are rather vague and depend largely on sportsmanship rather than refereeing. Two opponents, called *pehlivan*, meaning "heroes" or "wrestlers," cover themselves in a mixture of olive oil and water. They wear only a *kispet*, a pair of traditional leather breeches, from their waist to just below their knees. Metal studs across the pant bottoms reveal the wrestlers' names. There is no other protective padding or headgear. To win, you must pin your opponent belly-up by holding them to the ground or even carrying them five paces.

In olden times, the matches had no time limit, with wrestlers competing for hours under a scorching sun. There is no wrestling mat or arena, just a large open field, where a referee often chases after the two slippery opponents. Modern matches might last 30 minutes but are no less exhausting.

This type of wrestling is one of the world's most demanding sports. It was once the method for training the sultan's elite guards during the Ottoman Empire. In modern-day Turkey, oil wrestling is a lifelong endeavor, with wrestlers entering into master-apprentice relationships. Any true *pehlivan* is not just a champion wrestler but an exemplary member of society, a model of generosity, honesty, respect, and tradition. They are heroes in every sense of the word.
